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# INDIGENOUS SCHOLARSHIPS

Indigenous scholarships are available to Indigenous students seeking places at Georgiana Molloy Anglican School.

Georgiana Molloy Anglican School is a modern, progressive and successful Anglican School. As a school we are committed to providing educational opportunities to Indigenous students from Years LG -12.

Two scholarships are being offered each year for entry into our Middle School program which commences in Year 7.

Consideration will be given to entry into other years; however, Year 7 is the preferred point of entry.

Depending on financial need, scholarships may offer up to full remission of tuition fees from Year 7 to Year 12.

Applicants will be chosen according to current academic progress and proven application to study, willingness to contribute to the school community, leadership qualities and motivation for tertiary study, apprenticeships and career opportunities. Eligibility for Abstudy will also be taken into consideration.

Interviews for the school scholarship program are subject to change within the academic year.

## ELIGIBILITY

Students must be regarded as Indigenous Australians and should have sufficient self-confidence and personal support to enter a new school at Year 7 with the intention of continuing to Year 12.

## SELECTION CRITERIA

Academic levels and achievements of a student are considered, but are not the predominant criteria for selection. Selection is based on consideration of the following criteria:

### Academic

- Sufficient study skills to cope with the demands of the curriculum.
- Good work habits, e.g. completing homework, preparedness to tackle new work.
  - Interest in learning.
- Sound literacy and numeracy levels.

### Commitment

- Students must demonstrate a preparedness to commit to stay at the school until the completion of Year 12.

### Attitude

- Students must demonstrate a positive attitude to learning, be able to adjust to and respond positively to the school environment and have the social skills and confidence to relate well to others.

## PARENTAL/GUARDIAN SUPPORT

Students must have the support of their family and/or community. This support includes emotional support and some contribution to financial support. The level of financial contribution is reviewed on an individual and highly confidential basis, with the expectation that families/communities will contribute according to their capacity.

The Scholarship does not cover the provision of uniform, textbooks, IT equipment, or other school activities including excursions, camps and tours. Families are expected to participate in school programmes/information sessions, etc. as much as distance and travel permits and be supportive of their child's education.

## HOW TO APPLY

Complete the enclosed application form and include:

- Two most recent school reports of applicant.
- Two letters of reference, one from applicants current school Principal, one character reference.
  - NAPLAN Test results for Year 5 and or Year 7 (if applicable).
- Information from professionals pertaining to your child's academic, medical and social progress.
- Proof of Aboriginality / Indigenous Heritage e.g.: a reference from an Indigenous elder, verification via marriage, death or birth certificate or A 'letter of confirmation' that may be obtained from an incorporated Indigenous organisation and stamped with their common seal.
