



GEORGIANA MOLLOY STUDENT LEADERSHIP POSITIONS 2018

Applications are now invited for Year 11 students to apply for Leadership Positions in the School for 2018.

Applicants for positions in 2018 will be interviewed then rated based on the quality of individual written applications and interviews, prior to a student and staff vote to finalise positions. Please note that only short listed applicants will be part of the voting process.

Applicants should submit thorough applications that address the selection criteria and also need to interview well, by elaborating on aspects of their application. This process also places them in a position that is a real learning experience for the future.

Applicants need to apply for a “leadership position” only (not a specific role). The school will select the Head Boy, Head Girl, Student Representative Council President and Councillors (1 for each Year group, Years 7-12) plus House Captain positions from these applications (based on student and staff votes and the interview process). As such, applications should address the criteria for all leadership roles.

Prefect Portfolios

Please note that all positions will require a history of past involvement in whole school activities. Students are required to indicate in their letter of application a whole school project or area that they may wish to take a leading role in. This project will form the basis of their individual or joint '**Prefect portfolio**'. Existing portfolios include: Communication, environment/sustainability, arts, sport, academia, student welfare and school spirit. Students may end up sharing portfolios, have more than 1 portfolio and may also wish to nominate their own ideas for a portfolio.

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| SENIOR SCHOOL LEADERSHIP POSITION DESCRIPTIONS |
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Head Boy / Head Girl

Students must:-

- Provide strong leadership throughout the School. These students will meet with the Deputy Principal / Head of Senior School / Chaplain on a weekly basis to plan school activities and discuss general student needs.
- Represent the student body and the whole school in many public duties at functions as required from time to time eg. ANZAC Day, Open Days, Mother's/Father's Day, GMAS Ambassadors.
- Be confident and assured public speakers.
- Be able to accept responsibility for the preparation of assemblies and act as MC's at these events.
- Model appropriate behaviour, academic application, co-curricular involvement and courtesy and be an acceptable role model for other students.
- Be prepared to accept appropriate models of behaviour in relation to school rules and lead by example in these areas.
- Encourage student involvement in the co-curricular and sports program.
- Promote fair play at all times.
- Assist with special services and events; e.g. Foundation Day Service, Easter and Anzac Day.
- Model and encourage Christian values.
- Actively model the pursuit of academic excellence.

- Promote a caring and considerate attitude to all members of Georgiana Molloy Anglican School.
- Meet with the student leadership team on a regular basis (generally weekly).
- Write reports in the What's On and/or for The Settler, as required/allocated.
- Undertake any other role as delegated by the Principal.

Student Representative Council President:

Student must:-

- Chair and lead all SRC meetings.
- Lead a dynamic and progressive SRC.
- Feed back all key issues to students, staff and the wider community.
- Write regular SRC reports in the What's On and communicate SRC events via the Daily Bulletin.
- Represent the student body and the whole school in many public duties at functions as required from time to time eg. ANZAC Day, Open Days, Mother's/Father's Day, GMAS Ambassadors.
- Be a confident and assured public speaker.
- Be able to accept responsibility for the preparation of assemblies and act as MC's at these events.
- Model appropriate behaviour, academic application, co-curricular involvement, courtesy and be an acceptable role model for other students.
- Be prepared to accept appropriate models of behaviour in relation to school rules and lead by example in these areas.
- Assist with special services and events; e.g.: Foundation Day Service, Easter and Anzac Day.
- Model and encourage Christian values.

- Be a confident and assured public speaker.
- Model appropriate behaviour, academic application, co-curricular involvement, courtesy and be an acceptable role model for other students.

- Be prepared to accept appropriate models of behaviour in relation to school rules and lead by example in these areas.
- Assist with special services and events; e.g.: Athletics Carnivals, Foundation Day Service, Easter and Anzac Day.
- Represent the school at whole school functions eg. ANZAC Day, Open Days, Mother's/Father's Day, GMAS Ambassadors.
- Model and encourage Christian values.
- Actively model the pursuit of academic excellence.
- Promote a caring and considerate attitude to all members of Georgiana Molloy Anglican School.
- Undertake any other role as delegated by the Principal.

Prefects/House Captains:

Students must:-


- Assist and support the Head Boy and Head Girl with their duty statements.

- Speak at assemblies about school matters from time to time.
- Be able to accept responsibility for the preparation of assemblies and act as MC's at these events.
- Assist the staff in the organisation and management of school events.
- Be able to show strong leadership in Inter-House sporting or cultural/artistic events.
- Represent the school at whole school functions eg. ANZAC Day, Open Days, Mother's/Father's Day, GMAS Ambassadors.
- Provide positive leadership to the students.
- Meet with the student leadership team on a regular basis (generally weekly).
- Undertake any other role as delegated by the Principal.
- Exhibit excellent behaviour at all times and be a positive role model to students in the Middle and Senior School.

Candidate profile:

Candidates wishing to apply for leadership positions should have demonstrated:

- Leadership and regular participation in whole school activities.
- An involvement in community service and co-curricular activities.
- Excellent work ethic in their chosen WACE studies.
- Exemplary behaviour during their time at school.
- The ability to lead others in a positive manner.
- Exemplary attendance throughout their schooling.
- The development of strong and positive relationships with a wide range of their peers and staff over an extended period.
