As an Anglican co-educational day school for students from Pre-Kindergarten to Year 12, Georgiana Molloy Anglican School (GMAS) values the unique potential of each student. Under our care, we believe in offering a supportive, caring learning environment and a diverse curriculum that inspires each individual to follow their passion.

Our diverse co-curricular opportunities in art, academia, sport or music encourages our students to discover new interests, work with others in a range of environments, acquire their leadership style and broaden their relationships beyond their immediate peers.

Scholarships at GMAS

Each year, we offer a range of scholarships to students who display talent in a variety of areas including, but not restricted to, academic achievement, the arts, leadership, physical ability and service to the community.

These are students who will benefit substantially by attending GMAS, and who in turn will make a contribution to the holistic life of the school.

All scholarship holders are expected to display ongoing sustained commitment to their studies and to take a full and constructive part in the life of the school in the areas of their interests, aptitudes and abilities, at all times following the GMAS Student Code of Conduct.

Old Georgian Scholarships

Old Georgian scholarships are awarded to students who display outstanding talent, aptitude and motivation in a number of specific areas. Commitment to community service should be displayed.

Who can apply?

Students due to commence Year 7 to 10, 2026.

Value of scholarship:

Scholarships ranging from 50-100% of tuition fees for the remaining duration of schooling at GMAS.

Principal's Scholarships

These 'all-rounder' scholarships are awarded to students who display talent, aptitude and motivation in a variety of areas.

Who can apply?

Students due to commence Year 7 to 10, 2026.

Value of scholarship:

50% of tuition fees for the remaining duration of schooling at GMAS.

Indigenous Scholarships

These scholarships are open to Indigenous students who demonstrate commitment and motivation in areas of academia, leadership and community.

Who can apply?

Students who identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander who are due to commence Years 7 to 10, 2026.

Value of scholarship:

Scholarships ranging from 50% to 100% of tuition fees for the remaining duration of schooling at GMAS.

How to apply

We welcome applications from talented and motivated students who believe they can make a positive contribution to the GMAS community.

To apply for a 2026 scholarship, please complete the Scholarship Application Form at the end of this document, including:

- Why you are applying for the Scholarship.
- Addressing out GMAS values of Respect, Accomplishment, Inclusion, Spirituality and Empathy.
- An indication of your skills and talents.
- A portfolio showcasing significant achievements and examples of how you live the GMAS Values (certain evidence will also need to be submitted, as outlined in the form). Applicants are also required to complete a registration for the scholarship selection test. The test will be held at GMAS on 3 May 2025. This will incur a \$88 registration fee. If you have concerns meeting the fee payment, please contact the School via (08) 9752 5252.

Applications are to be submitted electronically and should be emailed to **principalsoffice@gmas.wa.edu.au** by the due date (Friday 21 April, 2025). Late applications will not be accepted.

Applicant shortlisting

Successful shortlisted applicants will need to have provided all of the information requested in full, by the due date. Shortlisted applicants will be notified by telephone. Unsuccessful applications will be notified by mail.

Shortlisted applicants will be interviewed by a panel including the Principal. The student and at least one parent or caregiver will need to be present at the interview.

The final decision on awarding any scholarship rests with the Principal.

Scholarship conditions

- The number of scholarships awarded each year is dependent on the quality of applications and availability of places. The school reserves the right not to award any or all of the scholarships available.
- Scholarships do not cover the cost of books, stationery, uniforms, or discretionary charges such as camps or overseas trips.
- Scholarship holders are expected to maintain a high level of commitment to the whole school program. This includes school attendance, being a positive influence in all classes, completion of work, excellent citizenship, wearing the uniform correctly, attendance at school functions, active contribution to the co-curricular house and voluntary school activities and doing his/her best at all times.
- The scholarship will be tenable to the completion of Year 12 provided that the applicant's academic achievement, behaviour and involvement in the co-curricular program are met in line with the expectations of the scholarship.
- Students must demonstrate a preparedness to commit to stay at the school until the completion of Year 12.
- The family agrees to fully abide by the rules and conditions at GMAS as outlined in its Code of Conduct and policies.
- The scholarship supersedes any sibling discounts or special privileges.
- Should the Principal offer your child a scholarship, acceptance of the scholarship is required within five business days of the offer being made.
